Hosted by the National Commission on Correctional Health Care, the meeting will take place May 21-24 at the Sheraton Hotel in Phoenix, Arizona.

Correctional health care is a complex field. On Saturday and Sunday, preconference seminars will address fundamental topics in correctional health care, including NCCHC's standards for health services, nursing assessment and suicide prevention. On Monday and Tuesday, concurrent sessions will feature nearly 50 presentations in the areas of medical care, nursing, cost containment, legal issues, mental health care, juvenile services and much more. The conference also features an extensive exhibition where attendees may visit dozens of companies to learn about products and services available to assist them in their day-to-day responsibilities.
